## *Why Should I Buy My Pet's Medicine From My Veterinarian?*

With easy accessibility to the Internet and mail order companies these days, you may have thought about purchasing your pet's medicines from a supplier other than your veterinarian. There are several risk factors you should consider before you decide to buy from another source.

- Many medications that are administered to dogs are not safe for cats (they can be fatal if administered or within close contact), and the reverse is also true.
- Medications are usually dosed on a weight basis. Your vet must determine your pet's weight and calculate the correct dosage to achieve the desired effect. Your pet's current health condition may also alter the final dosage.
- Some medications must be kept in a controlled environment or refrigerated. The medications delivered to your vet are properly packaged so you don't have to worry about "spoiled" medicines.
- Some medications are not purchased directly from the supplier so they may be considered a purchase from "diverted sources". The supplier or the veterinary hospital cannot guarantee that the product is indeed what it claims to be, where the product may have been packaged from, or even what is inside the product.

Your pet's health and well-being, as well as your satisfaction as an informed, valued pet owner is your veterinarian's primary goal. Keep in mind also that medicine prescribed and purchased at your vet's office comes with the comfort of knowing that you and your pet are individuals and have distinct needs that can best be served by your veterinarian.

In deciding where to purchase medicines for your pets, you need to balance any cost savings with the unique services, guarantees, and expertise you receive from your veterinarian.
